#### JUNE 2022: Phase 1 for the Water Expansion Project

In mid-June 2022, we broke ground on the multiphase project for the expansion of piping water into residential households in our local Kenyan community in Nakuru County. This project will connect 100 households with running water sourced from our existing boreholes at Kaiyaba and Piave Primary Schools. The first phase of the project included the installation of an additional water tower and tank at the Piave borehole and a 10,000L storage tank at the Kaiyaba borehole, all to increase the water storage capacity at these locations.


### **JULY 2022:**

### Construction of New Tot **Classrooms at Kaiyaba Primary School**

The construction of two new classrooms at Kaiyaba Primary Marigat School began in July 2022. This Nyahururu project was funded by the CDF Nakuru (Community Development Fund) which Ekenywa donated the water needed for construction. The Nakuru two new classrooms were a much-needed addition due to the increase of student population in the local community. In 2021, with help from our donors, we also raised funds to purchase 50 new desks for the school.

### **JULY 2022: Planting the Kitchen Garden at Piave Primary** School

In July 2022, Piave Primary School planted beans in their kitchen garden for their school feeding program. Kinyanjui and the south Kitul Nat. Res. Ekenywa team re-educated the school staff on using the solar powered irrigation system we installed two years ago to help promote a bountiful harvest later in the year. The new headteacherst Nationa has shown enthusiasm for the irrigation technology, and is committed to ensuring his students have nutritious meals in school.

### **AUGUST 2022:** Phase 2 for the Water **Expansion Project**

In August 2022, Phase 2 for the Made Water Expansion Project came to a completion. This phase included the digging of trenches throughout the community and the installation of mainline piping for water mains to be used to connect 100 local households with running water. Our long established and successful community boreholes at Kaiyaba and Piave Primary Schools provide the water for this community expansion project.

### SEPTEMBER 2022: Long-Term Operations and Maintenance Planning

The Ekenywa team is always hard at work providing ongoing maintenance to our many facilities and project locations. It is critical for every Ekenywa project to have a long-term operations and maintenance plan. In September 2022, our dedicated maintenance team repaired and replaced toilet doors at Piave Primary School, ensuring the student body had the proper functioning facilities so they can focus on what matters most, their education.



Phase 3 for the Water Expansion Project began in early September 2022. This phase of the project entailed the implementation of line-by-line water connections to 100 individual households as they registered for the project. Community members were eager to receive their household water connections and were offering their assistance with digging trenches and installing the piping.




### **EMPLOYEE SPOTLIGHT** Ann Macheria, Ekenywa Administrator


